

**Hamilton County Commissioner's Court
Regular Session
May 14, 2019
9:00 A.M.**

Hamilton County Commissioner's Court met in regular session on Tuesday, May 14, 2019 at 9:00 A.M. with the following members present: County Judge Mark Tynes, Commissioners Johnny Wagner, Lloyd Huggins and Dickie Clary. Commissioner Keith Allen Curry was absent.

Tynes called the meeting to order and a quorum was established.

Citizen Robert Jackson led the invocation and Tynes led the pledges.

Hamilton County Chief Deputy Sheriff stood in the public comments and turned in the racial profiling report that has to be completed each year. (Recorded in Commissioner's Court Papers Book 62 Page 779)

Hamilton County Auditor also wanted to court to know that after going to a conference and seeing how badly a court can work together. He wanted the court to know what a pleasure it was to work with this court.

A motion was made by Clary and seconded by Huggins to approve the line item transfers. The motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Wagner and seconded by Huggins to approve the following consent agenda:

A motion was made by Clary and seconded by Huggins to approve the building use request from the American Legion Post #22 – Annex Parking lot – May 27, 11:00 Am. To 12:30 P.M. The motion carried unanimously. (Recorded in Commissioner's Court Papers Book 62 Page 824)

A motion was made by Clary and seconded by Huggins to declare an 8X12 portable building (his old office) as surplus. The motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Clary and seconded by to approve the exchange of a portable building owned by Hamilton County (precinct 3) for a 1600 gallon Polyethylene Water tank owned by the Shive Fire Deaprtment. This will help out precinct 4 facilities extremely weak well. The motion carried unanimously.

County Attorney Mark Henkes looked up the procedures in order for the closing of CR 419 in precinct 4. They are as follows: posting requirements, 8 landowners must sign a petition. That all has to be done be for it can be resubmitted to the court. (Recorded in Commissioner's Court Book 825)

Huggins didn't really have much to say about the Hamilton County Historical Jail. He did say that he had put in a call to Lee Evans and is waiting for him to return his call.

Tynes told the court that the Auxiliary Courtroom was ready. The court was all in agreement that we would start conducting all of our Commissioner's Court Meetings there beginning May 21, 2019 at 9:00 A.M.

Judge Tynes is still waiting for all the departments to turn their budget paperwork.

Tynes adjourned the court at 9:18 A.M.
